Kim Trottier, a graduate of the National School of Dental Therapy, has served the First Nations Health Authority in British Columbia for over a decade. Through her work spanning three Family Territories and ten Nations, she's cultivated invaluable relationships and learnings.

Inspired by these experiences, Kim founded Culturally Committed in 2021, offering a platform for non-Indigenous individuals to learn cultural safety directly from Indigenous mentors and elders. She has also contributed to the College of Dental Surgeons of B.C. and was appointed to the board of the BC College of Oral Health Professionals in 2022. Kim traces her ancestry to England, Ireland, and Germany, embodying her commitment to bridging cultural divides.
